## SFMSDC Launches Partners in Business Progress Mentor Protégé Program with the University of Miami

**Miami, FL-** The Southern Florida Minority Supplier Development Council (SFMSDC) launched its sixth cycle of the **Partners in Business Progress Mentor Protégé Program** on October 30<sup>th</sup>. The program matches emerging minority-owned companies with senior executives from the University of Miami (U of M) to assist them in gaining the tools and techniques to improve their operations, gain more customers and accelerate growth.

Nine protégés were selected through a competitive application process. Protégés completed an assessment to determine critical business needs and were matched with individuals that have the expertise to assist them in building capacity.
